

District Parsonage in our Sister District in Liberia nears completion.



This is the Kakata-Farmington River District Parsonage our district mission team started last spring. We are sending another \$5,000 this month to complete the interior of the house. These funds were raised from gifts for our district churches. This completes our commitment of \$20,000 for this project. We are sending \$1,400 raised by Fraser: Christ UMC for the purchase of an extended bar chainsaw for the district so they can cut their own lumber for future construction. We are also sending \$1,400 for the purchase of a motorcycle for the D.S. Rev. Albert Barchue, for mobility around the district. This money was raised by a member of Eastpointe: Immanuel UMC who sold his motorcycle and donated the money and from a Liberia Project Presentation Dinner, a fundraising project by Warren: First UMC and the Liberia Mission Team.

The next project we will tackle is to raise \$6,000 for putting a roof on and a floor in the Wayzon UMC.
